

Past the Texas border to the east lies the Tulane University gymnastics club. Tulane is Louisiana's oldest club team, located right in the heart of New Orleans. The private school has been the home of some of the most dedicated gymnasts in the south, travelling to competitions as far east as Atlanta, Georgia and as far west as Austin, Texas in pursuit of their passion.

Gymnastics first came to the University in 1969 with the arrival of coach Paul Price. With minimal funding and no competitions, gymnastics was a recreational club and introductory classes were offered on campus. Over the next decade, the club grew and eventually became competitive. In the years since then the on campus gym has been removed, but the club has lived on and the sport has evolved into what it is today, competing against opponents such as The University of Texas, Texas A&M, Georgia Tech and Kennesaw State, just to name a few.

The Tulane team practices at an off campus facility 8-9:30 Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, and 3pm on Sundays, and membership is open to any currently enrolled student at the university.
